





Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Greetings and prayerful best wishes at the beginning of a new year, which brings with it the hope of peace and prosperity for all.

Unfortunately, however, these are increasingly divisive and disturbing times for our country and our world. Those who live on the margins of society are frightened. In particular, our immigrant brothers and sisters find themselves challenged and facing an uncertain future. The key question in a moment like this is, "Who are we?" We must remind ourselves of the fundamental importance of our being, recognizing that who we are can offer a counterpoint to what the world around us has become.

All of humanity possesses a dignity given to us as God's creation. Each of us, no matter our race, language, or creed, has been created in God's image and likeness. Only with this conviction of our sacred and shared identity as God's sons and daughters can we hope to boldly proclaim the possibility of peace amidst the uproar of these distressing times.

As Christians, we profess a God who entered into our humanity and lived amidst the challenges of this world – as a refugee child fleeing his homeland, as an itinerant preacher without a home and dependent on others' kindness, and as a misunderstood minister who was deemed a criminal and faced persecution and death on a cross. The life of Jesus challenges us to consider how we treat those who are refugees, those who are seeking a home, and those who are unjustly deemed criminals.

Since its founding, this nation has been a refuge for those fleeing war, poverty, and persecution elsewhere in the world. "Give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses yearning to breathe free," our Statue of Liberty proclaims. Throughout its history, our nation has strived to recognize the dignity of human life and to care for the common good of our society.

The Church, forming its members as faithful citizens of this nation, affirms the importance of laws that secure the safety and security of all who call this nation home. As such, the U.S. Catholic bishops recognize that a nation must have control of its borders and establish orderly processes for immigration. However, our immigration laws, legal processes, and systems must recognize and respect the God-given dignity of every person and serve to help us be one nation, under God, with liberty and justice for all.

The blanket criminalization of migrants, together with the indiscriminate mass deportation of people, places our nation in crisis and does not serve the common good. For decades, the U.S. Catholic bishops have called for legislators to set aside partisan differences and work together toward the reform of our immigration laws. This call has greater urgency today. The common good demands

more than simply discarding policies of the past. It calls for thoughtful plans that promote fairness in the immigration system as well as protect and strengthen our communities.

The Archdiocese of Cincinnati has become a home to many families seeking to escape poverty, violence, and persecution in their home countries. Families from Haiti, Venezuela, and elsewhere have been welcomed and have begun to contribute to their new home. Springfield, for example, has faced remarkable challenges in recent years, yet it has also created a promising future for itself by productively integrating migrant newcomers into its workforce, communities, churches, and schools. Mass deportation jeopardizes the unity of families and the stability of communities that have worked hard to integrate their new members.

Along with my brother bishops, your pastors, and other Church leaders, I offer you my support and spiritual closeness as you navigate the way forward. May we never grow weary in our efforts to end the dehumanizing and demonizing rhetoric that seeks to overtake us. May we treat each other with the dignity and respect, mercy and compassion due our brothers and sisters. And may God bless us with the discipline to strive tirelessly to bring about justice for all.

Profoundly grateful for all those who advance the principles of life, dignity, and the common good, I join with all people of goodwill in a commitment to continued prayer and action that promotes peace and seeks prosperity for all.







My Dear Brothers in Christ,

Happy New Year! I hope the Christmas celebrations in your parishes and with your families and friends were joyful, and that you also found some time to rest and renew yourselves.

I am pleased to provide you with some important information about how we will continue to journey together in serving our local Church in these coming years, meeting the missionary moment, discerning God's will for our future, and radiating the love of Jesus Christ more fully.

As I previously have stated, Beacons of Light will continue to assist us in discerning how we live out our Catholic faith in this moment in time. However, the phases of this five-year effort will conclude in the summer of 2027. How we transition from the phases of this initiative into the ongoing work of our parishes, schools, and institutions becomes the question. We understand that Beacons of Light is more than a program; it is an invitation for us to remain dedicated to living out the six foundational principles of vitality and missionary discipleship for years to come.

To assist in readying ourselves for 2027, we will incorporate Family Unity Discernment into the phases of Beacons of Light. This will assist us in determining the best use of our resources, especially our temporal and physical resources. This discernment, which will take place deanery by deanery between April 2026 and June 2027, will provide us with a clear picture of our archdiocese, its structures and resources, so that, with the culmination of the phases of Beacons of Light, we can be more intentional in how we build the Kingdom of God in the coming years. You have already heard the basics of this from the Department of Pastoral Vitality, and can read more [here](#).

All Families of Parishes will participate in Family Unity Discernment, including single-parish Families and those Families who have already unified canonically. The work of discerning the best use of our buildings, our resources, and our personnel to serve the Gospel in the new apostolic age is an ongoing endeavor that requires the partnership of all Families within a Deanery. The meetings and the work of Family Unity Discernment have been designed so as to not be an additional burden but rather to assist Families of Parishes in carrying forth the goals and objectives of Beacons of Light.

Please expect to hear more about Family Unity Discernment from our team at the Pastoral Center in the coming weeks.

Finally, after much prayer and discernment, and in consultation with the Archdiocesan Pastoral Council and the Presbyteral Council, I have decided that we will be conducting an Archdiocesan Synod in the coming years. In accord with Pope Leo's call for a more synodal Church, and in light of the more than fifty years that have passed since the last synod was held, Synod 2027 will begin to take shape this year, culminating in a General Assembly that will coincide with the conclusion of the phases of Beacons of Light. The synod will be announced in a forthcoming letter to the faithful that your parish communications staff will receive soon. Included in that letter will be a link to a webpage with the basics of the synodal process I am envisioning.

I look forward to our one-day presbyteral convocation this fall and the opportunity for us to reflect on all of these issues - Beacons of Light, our unity in mission, the synod, and our continued fraternity.

Thank you for your continued dedication to our local Church and your commitment to carry on the mission and ministry of Christ amidst God's people here. Please keep me in your prayers and know that you are always in mine.

Mark your calendar Unity Discernment Day Date: February 21, 2026, Venue: St. Benedict the Moor Time 8:30am to 2:30pm

As Beacons of Light progresses into its fourth year, the Center for Parish Vitality (CPV) – after consultation with Archbishop Casey – is proposing a two-fold approach toward completing the Planning (4) and Mission (5) phases of the Beacons of Light Pastoral Planning Pathway.

It is clear (for a variety of reasons) that most Families of Parishes will not be far enough along in Phases 1, 2, and 3 (Leadership, Vision, and Culture) to complete Phases 4 & 5 (Planning and Mission) by June 30, 2027, the stated completion of the project. This would mean that most Families will not have discerned or created plans for unification by June 2027 (as required by Parameter 3).

One key milestone of the Phase 4 Planning is to “create a plan for becoming a canonical parish that is unified in vision and mission.” To support that, CPV has been creating a Family Unity Discernment (FUD) process that could be undertaken before, during, or after Phase 4. We as a pilot, Holy Spirit Family of Parishes will have our Discernment on February 21, 2026, beginning at 8:30am at St. Benedict the Moor multipurpose room we are proposing that all invited here from our Families of Parishes participate in the FUD process with support from CPV from the archdiocese. There will be deanery wide in April 2026 and June 2027, independent of the Planning and Mission phases of the Pathway.




