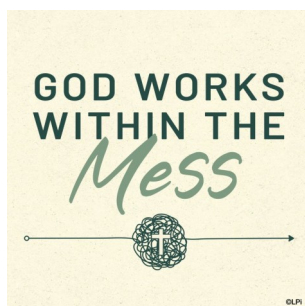

From the Pastor's Desk—Beacon's Update

4/14/26 Meeting Summary – Pastoral Council, Finance Council & Leadership Team

Attendees: Fr. Francis Tandoh, members of the Councils, Leadership Team and Unity Discernment team (members of Finance Council responsible for providing financial and maintenance data about all parishes) to support the BoL Family Unity Discernment process

35 – 40 people were present

Fr. Francis and Lynne Mosley walked through a discussion of Findings from the HSFoP Reflect Synod Day Workshop held 2/21/26 at St. Benedict. Shared the documents (the findings from the Reflect Synod and the Unity Discernment team documents – finances and deferred maintenance about all parishes) to support informed discussion. The Findings document was prepared by the archdiocese BoL team members who facilitated the Reflect Synod Day. Mike Lippman was the leader.

Primary Findings:

Communications – continue improvement; “Plain Talk”, Transparency and Frequent

Action items: Update parishioner contact info for better telecommunications, move to a single system for FoP. Update and improve church website – hire someone to assist (Comms function may be combined with Youth & Young Adult Outreach); More frequent bulletin updates (share same information in multiple bulletins)

Emotional & Spiritual Support of FoP – Change (move to a canonical parish) is a grieving process. Acknowledge this and provide Holy Spirit-based support. Increase opportunities for storytelling and share experiences among parishioners.

Action items: Use 33 Days of Eucharist Adoration, Pentecost Novena to start; Monthly event to build on unity; First unity event in July/August 2026, include a breakout session where parishioners identify and incorporate the traditions and practices of current parishes, that they we want to ensure as part of new canonical parish Youth Engagement & Evangelization are important – Recognized as important based on the average age of parishioners attending masses and need to grow the FoP.

Action items: Hire someone to lead this effort and coordinate with Diversity Outreach lead and Evangelization team

Volunteerism & Leadership within FoP need attention – Work to reorganize volunteers serving on commissions and leading service activities - want seniors in a “train the train” role to equip younger parishioners to take on more responsibilities.

Financial Sustainability - Discernment of uses/costs of Buildings (Church & Non-Church) is necessary as our current financial situation will not allow us to maintain all buildings.

Action items: Current consideration – non church buildings under review for sell and/or rental. Church buildings still to be reviewed.

Key Takeaways:

Findings from BoL (Beacons of Light) CPV (Center of Parish Vitality) team was more detailed. Recommended that we state clear action items, identify low-hanging fruit. Pay attention to the financial sustainability concerns.

Meeting attendees agreed on the following:

The five identified concerns were consistent with our observations.

Discussion from members that the five churches together were stronger and financially-viable, together (i.e. we can't continue as separate parishes).

We discussed details within financial and maintenance documents from the Unity Discernment process (contributions and age of those contributing (70+, 146 of 363 people), our revenue as compared to entire archdiocese, only 38% of parishioners contributing, etc. Many reflected that merger was the optimal approach as it was an approach that we were familiar with (based on past mergers) and that we should move forward with a focus on Jesus and our vision to foster discipleship and make the Eucharist the center of our lives.

Breakout Session Results:

We engaged in a breakout session (where 5 groups with 7+ representatives from each parish) to address the question: Which of the parishes should be considered the canonical parish center.

Everyone was encouraged to speak and offer an opinion and discuss the “why” of their opinion

Consensus was St Benedict; Only 2 people out of 35+, suggested a site other than St. Benedict (1 suggested Q of M and 1 suggested OLG.

Sonshine in a Bag

St. Augustine's Love in Action Report for "Sonshine in a Bag".

From November 1, 2025, until May 31, 2026. There were 233 large cans of green beans, and 231 large cans of corn donated in the box at the foot of the stairs, as well as a few miscellaneous items. Also donated were peanut butter, Complete dinners and Ziplock sandwich bags which are used by "Sonshine". Please make sure that any donations have not expired because they can't be used by "Sonshine" or the local food pantries. There were monetary donations given on Sundays that thanks to Meijer's helping our Church's donations go further. Let us purchase a total of 1920 large cans of corn and green beans for "Sonshine" during their fall and spring sale. "Sonshine" is deeply grateful for our Church's contributions, and the seven members from our Church who help with the two monthly packings. We have been able to supply vegetables for every packing for the roughly 209 children in the Valley View school system that are helped by "Sonshine". We will continue concentrating on monetary donations in the "Sonshine" envelopes found at the bottom of the stairs that can be dropped in the collection basket. Or canned green beans and corn donations left in the bin at the bottom of the stairs for our Church to be able to supply the vegetables for the next school year that starts in August.

The Weeds We Need

Driving up my street in late spring, you can see which yard is mine from a whole block away: it's the one covered in dandelions. And I like it that way.

I fear neither my husband's shame nor the snarky comments of neighbors: I will never apologize for my dandelion-filled yard. "It's for the pollinators," I say, but it's a total lie. I just think it looks lovely. Who doesn't like a splash of yellow after a long, dreary winter?

People call dandelions "weeds," but it's just not true. Weeds are, by definition, any plant growing where it isn't wanted. A rosebush is a weed, if it's in the middle of a cornfield. I want my dandelions. Plants that are commonly considered weeds can even have beneficial properties.

They attract pollinators, for instance, and they promote nutrient cycling, whereby soil health is improved.

We all have metaphorical "weeds" in the garden of our lives. I certainly do: facets of my personality I loathe, realities of my life I resent, limitations in my abilities I dread—these are my weeds, and their roots run deep, coiling closely around those of the plants I try to cultivate. But if I could rid my garden of any one of these weeds, would it really benefit me? And if I examined them all closely, could I tell them apart—the blessing from the curse, the struggle from the triumph?

One day, it will all become clear: what is the wheat, and what is the weed. We will be put to our ultimate purpose, and we will see ourselves for what we are meant to be.

Until then, we need the weeds. It's not harvest time yet.

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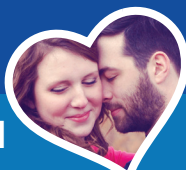
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
